### How to Choose Custom Commercial Printing

- Start from the product, audience, and how the item will be used, carried, displayed, mailed, or kept.
- Compare the child-category paths instead of assuming one material or construction fits every request.
- Treat material, finish, structure, packing, and compliance needs as specification questions until reviewed.
- Avoid fixed claims about lead time, MOQ, certifications, or shipping before the final specification is confirmed.

### Choose the Right Custom Commercial Printing Type

- Custom Cards — Custom Cards for projects where the exact size, material direction, artwork, finish, and use case should be confirmed before production.

- Custom Posters — Custom Posters for projects where the exact size, material direction, artwork, finish, and use case should be confirmed before production.
- Custom Brochures — Custom Brochures for projects where the exact size, material direction, artwork, finish, and use case should be confirmed before production.
- Custom Magazines — Custom Magazines for projects where the exact size, material direction, artwork, finish, and use case should be confirmed before production.
- Custom Booklets — Custom Booklets for projects where the exact size, material direction, artwork, finish, and use case should be confirmed before production.
- Custom Flyers — Custom Flyers for projects where the exact size, material direction, artwork, finish, and use case should be confirmed before production.

## **Custom Printing and Specification Notes**

Custom Commercial Printing projects should start from the real use case rather than a generic product name. The important questions are size, artwork, material direction, finish, packing, usage environment, and the child category that best describes the request.
