### How to Choose Custom Keychains

- Start from the product, audience, and how the item will be used, carried, displayed, mailed, or kept.
- Compare the child-category paths instead of assuming one material or construction fits every request.
- Treat material, finish, structure, packing, and compliance needs as specification questions until reviewed.
- Avoid fixed claims about lead time, MOQ, certifications, or shipping before the final specification is confirmed.

### Choose the Right Custom Keychains Type

- Custom Plastic Keychains — Custom Plastic Keychains for projects where the exact size, material direction, artwork, finish, and use case should be confirmed before

production.

- Custom Metal Keychains — Custom Metal Keychains for projects where the exact size, material direction, artwork, finish, and use case should be confirmed before production.
- Custom Acrylic Keychains — Custom Acrylic Keychains for projects where the exact size, material direction, artwork, finish, and use case should be confirmed before production.
- Custom Leather Keychains — Custom Leather Keychains for projects where the exact size, material direction, artwork, finish, and use case should be confirmed before production.
